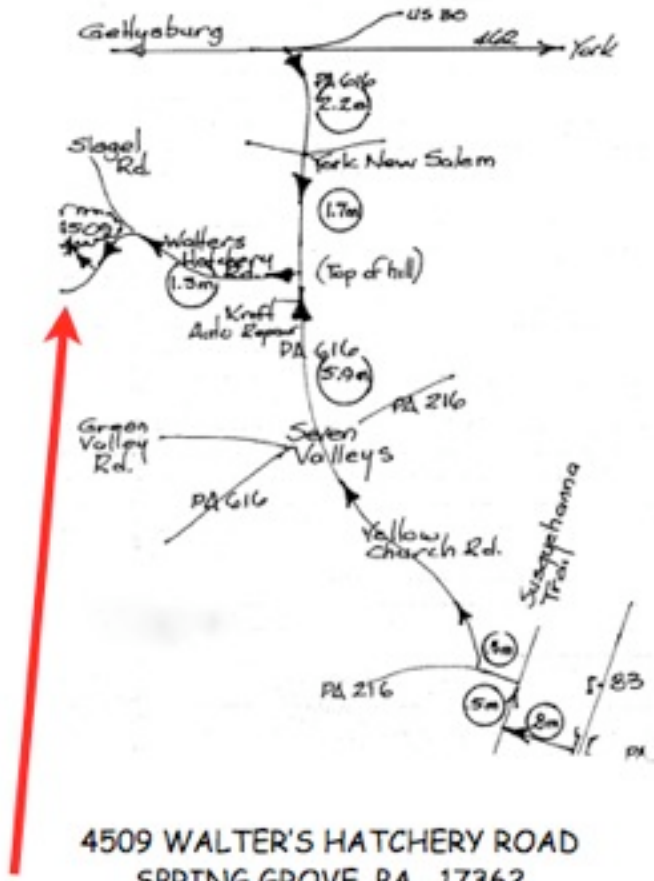
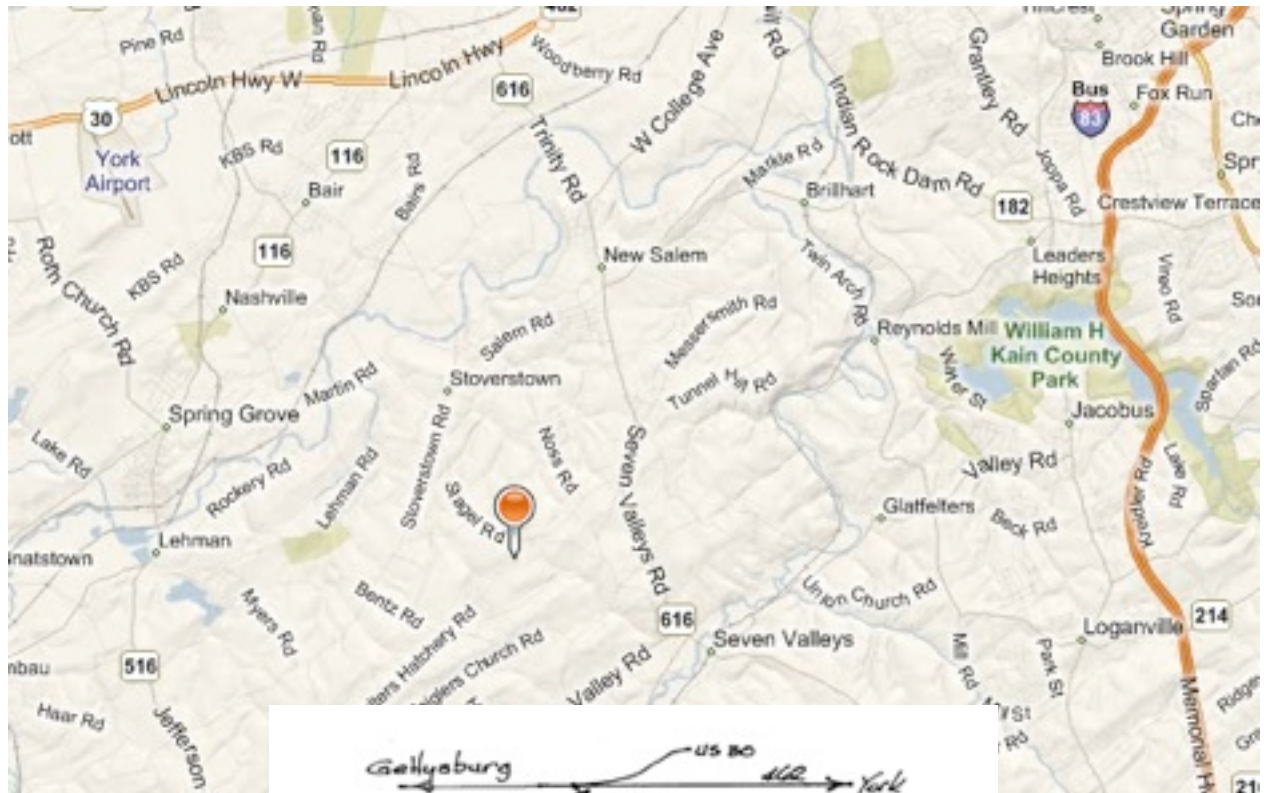
## ELECTION OF OFFICERS
