## WOODWORKING TIPS

### Cheap Drilling Jig

For a cheap and accurate line-drilling jig for shelf support holes, use T-Nuts. Lay out a piece of plywood to the desired spacing and drill holes that will accept the T-Nuts. Insert the T-Nuts, use a stop collar on a brad point bit with your hand drill, and drill away. A 1/4" T-Nut will accommodate a 3/16" bit and a 5/16" T-Nut will accommodate a 1/4" bit.

You can pick up T-Nuts at Home Depot or anywhere that has bulk hardware.
